

TEE CEE FULL BIOG

Tee Cee is the funky fresh colourful girl in town and made her TV debut as a Presenter on CBBC's Saturday morning show 'Whoops I Missed The Bus' as well as featuring as a guest presenter in CBBC shows 'How To Be Epic @ Everything Series 3' and 'All Over The Place Asia part 2'.

A born creative, Tee Cee first made headlines when she wrote and self published a young adult fiction book 'Snow Black The Seven Rastas and Other Short Stories' at the age of 16. This led to coverage from the likes of the BBC, The Voice news and other mainstream media.

Since graduating from The Peter Jones Enterprise Academy launched by Dragons den tycoon Peter Jones, Tee Cee has worked across different area's of media from Magazine Journalism including a stint at Closer and Heat, broadcast journalism; where she had her own radio segment on Newstyle community radio and completed an NCTJ Broadcast Journalism qualification in her role as a Broadcast Assistant Apprentice at BBC West Midlands 95.6 to then progressing into TV where she worked as a Runner in BBC Children's Development team for just two months before landing her first TV presenting gig on Whoops I Missed The Bus.

Tee Cee's major influence on young people was proved when she was recognised as a Black History Month hero by a Birmingham based primary school. When she's not on screen, Tee Cee can be found inspiring the next generation through motivational talks at professional speaking engagements and workshops for corporate events, conferences and schools, vlogging on her own YouTube channel and empowering young women through original, educational and quirky content on her own lifestyle website 'Skool Girl Online' which she launched aged 19. With a YouTube channel alongside of it, Skool Girl Online is where you can see all of Tee Cee's talents in full swing from writing, to presenting to original idea's and her unique fashion sense with her signature colourful pop socks and bold lipstick colours!

In just a short space of time Tee Cee has become a face of the UK young entrepreneurship scene and has produced and coordinated Birmingham's annual Celebrating Youth Excellence Awards, has been awarded and nominated for several awards including: Aspire Award – West Midlands Women of the Year Awards (Winner, 2015), nominated

for Unltd's Young Social Entrepreneur Award (2014), received a Diana Award aged 17 and became a face for Grant Thornton's Vibrant Economy in 2016 which landed her face in a giant visual on their head quarters building which previously featured opposite London Euston station.

Now Tee Cee is pursuing her next big venture in presenting where she has also hosted on the BBC's main stage at the NEC for the Skills Show which attracted over 72,000 visitors and presented videos for new apprenticeship schemes for the BBC Careers website.

Excitingly in 2016 Tee Cee was picked to present on 'Whoops I Missed The Bus', beating many who also screen tested for the vlogging spot. With a passion for children's television Tee Cee wowed producers and the commissioner with her bubbly personality and youthful nature.

Tee Cee continued to grab attention from series producers across BBC Children's Production's and was asked to present a segment in the third series of 'How To Be Epic @ Everything' and then was approached by BBC Children's Scotland to travel to South Korea as a guest presenter for their show 'All Over The Place Asia'.

Tee Cee is a unique talent whose bright style, infectious personality and inspirational journey have sparked huge interest within the business and children's television world.

In 2018, Tee Cee has presented on 'Whoops I Missed The Bus Series 4' and 'All Over The Place Asia Part 2' on CBBC.
